Levels of Certificates

Level 3

Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 3/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This level certificate allows you to participate in a disaster as an ADSW Evacuation Driver.

Level 2

Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 2/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This certificate allows you to participate in non-emergency transport.

Level 1

Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 1/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This certificate allows you to move equipment or supplies.
