LECTURE 3.5 HOURS

Before you start your trip:

Incident Command System (ICS) Considerations

DRIVING LABORATORY – 4 HOURS

Limited to 20 Trailers, 20 Drivers and 20 Assistants

- Checking your electric brake battery and adjusting your brakes
- Checking your hitch, tires and lights
- Setting your mirrors
- Backing, turning, and U-turns (driving patterns provided at RSVP). There will be 4 practice stations. The instructor will be available to assist you during practice; notify him when you are ready to be tested.

Levels of Certificates

Level 1 Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 3/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This certificate allows you to participate in emergency transport.

Level 2 Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 2/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This certificate allows you to participate in non-emergency transport.

Level 3 Certificates will be awarded to those who receive a 1/3 score for each of the 3 maneuvers. This certificate allows you to move equipment or supplies on property.
